POINTS FROM THE MISSIONARY'S PEN...

There are many issues that face our nation and all of us as citizens of this nation. Issues that we hear so much about from those who lead in government are:

Stabilization of the economy and increasing industry in the U.S.

Rebuilding the Infrastructure of our roads and bridges

Supporting and maintaining Medicare for Sr. Adults and maintaining social security

Securing our borders

Building a strong military

Dealing with illegal aliens in our present society and into the future

Providing health care at a reasonable cost

These are some of the issues repeated over and over again as we listen to the news and discussions of those who seem to be in the know about these critical problems.

But I share with you in this brief note that the greatest issue facing our nation is the issue of murdering unborn babies through abortion. Listen to these figures and if it does not send a chill up and down your spine you are senseless and distorted as a person and especially as a believer in Jesus Christ.

According the abortion counter that keeps up with the abortions in our nation

As of 12:05 p.m. on Thursday 1/11/18 for the day there had been 1280 abortions

Since 1973: Roe verses Wade there have been 60,068,842 abortions

By planned parenthood since 1970 there have been 7,986,270 abor-

tions

By planned parenthood this year 10,026

In the U.S. this year 2018 there has been 26,660

In the U.S. this year after 16 weeks gestation 1279

In the U.S. this year due to rape 258

In the U.S. in the Black community since 1973 there has been 18,020,658

Here is what I thought about as I read this data and information, I thought what a sad commentary on the moral values of our nation that we have laws that make it legal to murder the unborn. The unborn are the most valuable resource that has ever been given to a nation. To destroy life of a little boy or girl who would in the future of living have had the awesome possibilities of becoming a doctor, a lawyer, a dentist, a bookkeeper, a teacher, a soldier, an engineer, a part of the labor force of America, a wife, a mother, a husband, a father a contributor to the very fabric of our nation, God's most valuable gift to humanity sacrificed on the altar of pleasure and inconvenience. You see this issue of abortion is the most pressing issue our nation faces. It is the most critical issue to be addressed by our churches today. It is hard to fathom there are Christian (or may I say professing Christians) who support the abortion laws and the choice of a woman to abort her unborn baby. We need to remember that to the Creator there is no time in the process of birthing a human being that life is not of great value to God from conception all the way till the end of life.

We must get involved in confronting those who give leadership in our local government all the way to the state and national level to abolish Roe vs Wade and turn us BACK to the protection of human life from conception forward We must pray that God would remove the insensitivity and forgetfulness of the death of human beings through the murder of helpless babies. This issue must become a daily issue that we bring to the throne room every day till change comes.

What if no change comes in attitude and action? God will judge our nation for its callousness and

EFFECTIVE MISSION



PREPARE

Preparation is key to an effective mission. Prayer must be an integral part of any mission trip. Prayer

before, during and after is critical. This not only includes the participants prayer but also involving other team members in prayer and including non-team members in prayer on behalf of the team and the mission to take place. The sending church is also to be involved in praying on behalf of the team and the mission. Communication with God, prayer, must have a high priority in preparing for any Great Commission mission.

The personal spiritual walk of the team members must be elevated as well. Mission teams engaging lost people and going to places where the gospel is not present means members will be in areas Satan has had control and where spiritual warfare is intensified. Personal Bible study and spiritual preparation are key to a successful mission trip.

A corporate daily devotional by the team is necessary. Keeping the team accountable to their walk with God during the mission journey is of vital importance. Keeping the things of God in the forefront, the mission of God for the team, is needed to keep the team on task to be about the Father's business.

Preparing team members in conversational evangelism, Bible storying, worldview, spiritual warfare, prayer-walking, strategic prayer, orality, the culture to be encountered, religions and cults to be encountered, security, and safety are basic mission topics that need to be addressed prior to entering the mission field. I continue to be amazed at the teams that go to the mission field completely unprepared and have failed to address these basic issues and mission topics. Going unprepared increases the opportunity for mistakes and certainly makes the mission much less effective, if not down right ineffective.

Meeting as a team in advance of the trip is great preparation for getting to know each other. It also serves the purpose of bonding the team so they can work cooperatively on the field. A dysfunctional team can destroy a mission trip and can slow and hinder the mission on the field. When missionary or national partners are involved, the teams' cooperation is key to ongoing relationships and effective cooperative work on the field.

Emergency medical and repatriation insurance is a must especially for travel internationally. The POBA uses Missionary Travel Association (<https://missionarytravelassociation.com>). Others have used Gallagher Charitable (<https://www.travelwithgallagher.com>). Teams should also consider purchasing trip cancellation and curtailment insurance to cover unexpected delays or trip cancellation, as well as lost baggage.

A daily team debriefing is helpful in day-to-day preparation. Teams are exposed to new, sounds, smells, stimulants, foods, environments and often need to express their thoughts and emotions related to each days' events and experiences. The daily debriefing helps prepare the team to be effective in upcoming days on the field. An end-of-trip debriefing is good to help members process things they have experienced on the mission field as they come back to their home environment.

Physical preparation is mandatory for environments that require a lot of walking or riding in high or low altitudes different from the home area. Addressing physical preparedness for the mission should begin immediately upon a members confirmed participation in the mission.

Physical, mental, emotional, and especially spiritual preparedness are essential to an effective mission experience as you seek to engage, as God leads, in the Great Commission.

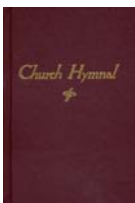
WMU INSPIRATIONAL MEETING

WHAT WE BELIEVE AS SOUTHERN BAPTISTS

Each month we focus on a different topic in the Baptist Faith and Message (BFM). You may obtain a copy of the BFM (in print or by email) by contacting our office.

IV. Salvation

Salvation involves the redemption of the whole man, and is offered freely to all who accept Jesus Christ as Lord and Saviour, who by His own blood obtained eternal redemption for the believer. In its broadest sense salvation includes regeneration, justification, sanctification, and glorification. There is no salvation apart from personal faith in Jesus Christ as Lord.

A. Regeneration, or the new birth, is a work of God's grace whereby believers become new creatures in Christ Jesus. It is a change of heart wrought by the Holy Spirit through conviction of sin, to which the sinner responds in repentance toward God and faith in the Lord Jesus Christ. Repentance and faith are inseparable experiences of grace. Repentance is a genuine turning from sin toward God. Faith is the acceptance of Jesus Christ and commitment of the entire personality to Him as Lord and Saviour.

B. Justification is God's gracious and full acquittal upon principles of His righteousness of all sinners who repent and believe in Christ. Justification brings the believer unto a relationship of peace and favor with God.

C. Sanctification is the experience, beginning in regeneration, by which the believer is set apart to God's purposes, and is enabled to progress toward moral and spiritual maturity through the presence and power of the Holy Spirit dwelling in him. Growth in grace should continue throughout the regenerate person's life.

D. Glorification is the culmination of salvation and is the final blessed and abiding state of the redeemed.

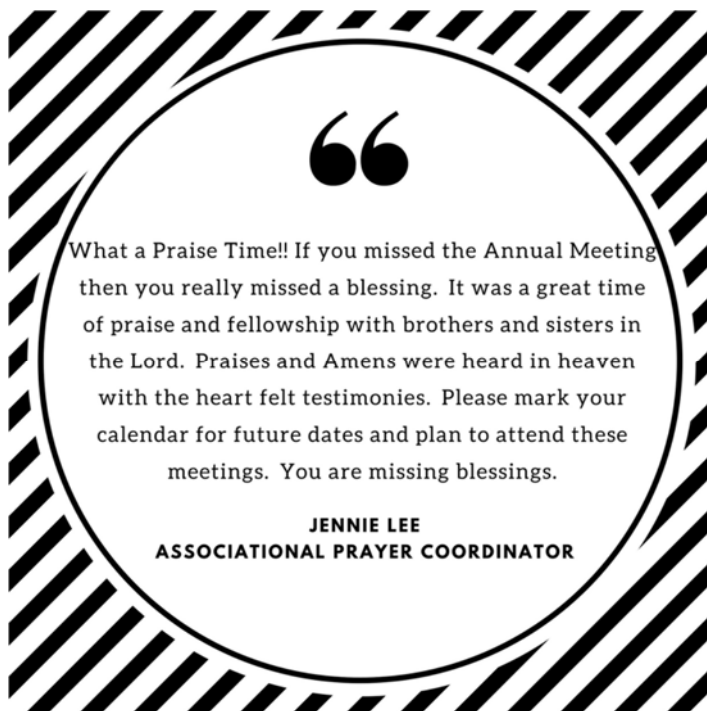
